GDPR Audit Checklist

Understanding your requirements, what your present processes are and identifying any gaps are the first steps toward GDPR compliance. It is important to conduct a data protection audit in order to achieve compliance. This checklist will help you get started on your journey to achieve compliance.





#1 Transparency and legal foundation

- Determine what information you process and who has access to it by conducting an information audit.
- Have a legal rationale for what you are doing with your data.
- In your privacy policy, provide explicit information about your data processing and legal justification.

#2 Data protection

- From the moment you start building a product to the moment you process data, data security should be a top priority.
- Personal data should be encrypted, pseudonymized, or anonymized whenever possible.
- Create an internal security policy for your employees and raise data security awareness.
- Know when it is time to conduct a data protection impact assessment and have a plan in place to do so.
- In the event of a data breach, have a procedure in place to notify the authorities and your data subjects.

#3 Governance and accountability

• Assign a processor or controller to be in charge of ensuring GDPR compliance throughout your company.

- Sign a data processing agreement between your company and any third parties who handle personal information on your behalf.
- Appoint a representative in one of the EU member states if your organisation is not based in the EU.
- A Data Protection Officer should be appointed (if necessary).

#4 Right to privacy

- Your consumers can easily request and receive all of the information you have on them.
- Your consumers may easily edit or update inaccurate or incomplete data.
- Customers can easily request that their personal data be removed.
- Customers can easily request that you stop processing their data.
- Customers can quickly obtain a copy of their personal information in a format that can be readily transferred to another company.
